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






























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Artist Biographies

The son of pioneering filmmakers, he was the founding executive director of Nia

His research includes cultural production, storytelling, and critical city building with a focus on mental health and actualization.

From the creators of Loss

In 2011 I had a winter of paralyzing sadness. I hid it and avoided my part in the events that sparked it. My interest in why so many of us battle depression and anxiety started that winter and led me to make Loss. Loss is a life project, I've been more interested in the personal process than its presentation, it is about me, my father, my family, and the death of my paternal grandmother Nora Rogers. It has been developed through an artist residency at The Theatre Centre and the unwavering support of Aislinn Rose.

lan and I started meeting weekly in 2016. My predecessor Franco Boni and I had met with him and he'd told us that our Residency model wasn't useful to him. It wasn't something we were used to hearing, so we asked "what do you need?". It's a key question for us at The Theatre Centre, but a question we sometimes forget to ask. It led to a conversation about a completely different model of working for lan's project Loss, starting with those weekly meetings. What I didn't realize at the time was how many years we would spend working together through lan's two Master's degrees and a global pandemic — or that those meetings would lead to one of the most meaningful creative relationships of my career. A few special shout-outs to the artistic community who have been in it with us: Luminato & Naomi Campbell, Why Not Theatre & Ravi Jain (who was the person who first recommended Residency to Ian), the entire team at the NAC's National Creation fund, TO Live & Josephine Ridge, and all the exceptional folks I get to work with at The Theatre Centre, past & present.

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
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
